

Percent Change in Violent Crime 2006 compared to same period in 2005



Homicide


 The Crime Emergency was declared after the disturbing spike in homicides in the beginning of July. Since then, the number of homicides has dropped to lower levels, with 13 in August and 14 in September.





Robbery


 As with homicides, the number of robberies decreased significantly when the Crime Emergency was implemented, and has stabilized at lower levels.

Alternative Curfew Hours


- In the 11 weeks since alternative curfew hours were set for juveniles under 17 years of age, there have been:
 - Fewer victims under 17 during curfew hours: The number of victims of violent crime on public space who were under 17 years of age has dropped 64% during curfew hours.
 - Fewer juveniles under 17 committing crimes during curfew hours: Arrests of juveniles under 17 for crimes committed during curfew hours have declined 46%, while also recording a 14% decline during the day.

(Excludes crimes inside a residence/building. Source: Preliminary data from daily SOCC report.)






Juvenile Crime during Curfew:
