The course must include material to help officers distinguish bias-related crimes from other crimes, to assist officers in understanding and assisting victims of these crimes, and to ensure that bias-related crime data is reported accurately as required under section 22-3702(b) of this chapter. "(b) The training course must be periodically updated as the Metropolitan Police force deems appropriate.
